

KINGFISHER COUNTY COMMISSIONER MINUTES

August 24, 2026

Minutes of the regular meeting of Kingfisher County Board of County Commissioners was held on August 24, 2026. Advanced notice of the meeting was posted on bulletin board next to the Commissioner's office and the north entrance on August 21, 2026 at 9:00 am.

1. Chairman Mike Sparks called the meeting to order at 9:00am with Commissioners Sparks leading the flag salute. Roll call was read with the following responses: Moss – present; Sparks – present; Schwarz – present.
2. Public Comment: Summarized: Agenda item #9; Robin Wolf-A citizen of Cashion voiced concerns that the City of Cashion had been on their property and testing their wells without contacting them. Robin asked members of the Logan County RWD#2 where are they going to be pulling water from and how would this affect Ag Producers in the area and would this be taking water from them, when they are already struggling to have enough water in their area right now. Robin requested that the Logan Co. RWD#2 be able to provide citizens in the area with as much information as they could. Stating we want the truth and facts about where the water will come from and if it will have an effect on those citizens/land owners in the area.

Charlie Robinson- Logan County RWD#2, mentions their intention is to expand west for the growth in the area and the citizens in the community and not specifically for any commercial use. Rural Water district has mentioned that they have gained the signatures of 17 citizens that have signed their petition for a hearing on the annexation and expansion of services. Wesley Short-A member of the Logan County RWD#2 mentions they are trying to assist with the growth in Cashion and towards the west to best serve the area by expanding the service area. He did respond by saying that the RWD does not have the authority to deny water to anyone be that a citizen or a business. There are water studies that have to be done and the RWD does not provide the lines to citizens or businesses, there are times when a person or business would have to pay to have lines laid to the area they are requesting. Many other citizens in attendance voiced their concerns about data centers coming to the area. Shauna Nelson invited everyone to try to be in attendance of the Piedmont meeting where cloverleaf would be presenting.

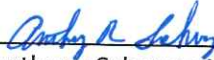
Motion passed with the following votes cast: Moss- Yes, Sparks-Yes, Schwarz-Yes.
